PATCHELL LIBRARY HISTORICAL CENTRE

PATCHELL REPORT

The most recent donation to our Patchell Library Historical collection prompted a read of the 1940 annual magazine to find the report of the holiday in Central Australia which took place that year. It is a whimsical composition reporting the event, but the author did not put her name to it, nor of anyone who went on it, except those of Rev. and Mrs Griffith, of Alice Springs, who organised their itinerary.

Our new donation is a photographic record of the holiday, which has been collated in a special monogrammed maroon album, illustrating aspects of the holiday. With a suitable inscription it was given to Rev. and Mrs Griffith in appreciation of their help and as a memento of the occasion.

The photos include the views of the places visited, but more interesting are those showing their transport on the back of a truck and on camels, and their outdoors dormitory.

The article includes some verses which begin "there were 17 girls

on the Alice Springs train", but a group photo shows 15 girls in uniform about to board the train and another with just the first names of a group of 11 – Una, Mary, Margaret, Helen, Marjorie, Cynthia, Evelyn, Jean, Lois, Joyce, and Edith. Two school mistresses, Miss Barclay, and Miss Brown, are in a photo with Mrs Griffith (are they the extra girls?) BUT most interestingly is a photo with just the initials JMH – Miss Harris in jodhpurs.
