Dear Old Scholar,

Welcome to our first newsletter for 2023.

As President of the Old Scholars Association, I acknowledge the wonderful effort and support of our past Presidents and committee members for their commitment to our Association. A special thanks goes to Chris Lopez and Glenys Edwards, who have dedicated many years of voluntary effort to ensure our Association remains connected and its history and extensive archives maintained. I am very grateful to my committee colleagues who have offered their ongoing support during my term as President, particularly as I work fulltime and may, at times, ask them to fill in for me when I am unable to attend Old Scholar events.



My journey with our school started in 1968 as a boarder (my family lived in Port Augusta) and in 1972 I became a *day bug*. These were transformative years in the school's history as Ruth Watts commenced as Principal in Term 2 of my first year. She replaced Jean Harris who had been headmistress for 28 years. Ruth was very student focussed and ensured the lesson timetable catered for all students' subject preferences. I recall her favourite word during assembly and public speeches was 'challenge'.

Living at home again with my four sisters and parents as well as socialising in third term, I repeated Year 12 in 1973. I shared my second Year 12 with my sister Jane and her friendly cohort and was co-Deputy Head Prefect with Ann Draper, supporting Helen Swift who was Head Prefect. I established wonderful friendships during my school years, which continue today. My original cohort celebrated our 50-year anniversary last year and this year I will be celebrating another 50-year anniversary with my 'second' Year 12 friends (see page 4 for details). Thirty years after I left school I was invited to be a member of Annesley Council and commenced the year my niece Claire Stanley was Head Prefect (2003).

Our Association, including our archives, moved location within the school grounds late last year. We are now on the first floor of Harris Wing as the School prepares to renovate Patchell Building for additional classrooms and administration (see page 2). More news about this in the next newsletter. On Friday, 5th May 2023 we have the return of Drinks@Gillingham between 6.30pm and 8.30pm for networking and re-connecting old scholars. We also welcome past staff and hope you and some of your school friends can join us and catch up with other old scholars (refer to separate newsletter item).

I look forward to keeping in touch with you during my term as President.

PATCHELL LIBRARY HISTORICAL CENTRE

100 YEARS AGO - 1923

MLC proudly celebrated its 21st birthday in April 1923 with a two-day grand fete and two evening concerts to raise funds to be able to donate an Old Scholars Association Scholarship as a birthday present to the College. The two concerts were arranged by two old scholars, Miss Hilda Gill (who presented on the Friday) and Miss Muriel Day (who presented on the Saturday). Friends, including men, took part, along with a wellknown artist.

Lady Bridges opened the fete on Friday 13 April and Mr James Gartrell opened the fete on the following day.





The College did not publish a 1922 annual magazine, but instead, a special 21st birthday edition was published in April 1923 as part of a fundraising exercise. A 1923 Christmas edition was also published that year, both list the names of all previous scholars and all the stall holders for the fete.

Besides the usual stalls of cake (2 stalls), sweets (2 stalls), afternoon tea, ice-cream (with fruit salad), bran pie (lucky dip) and flowers. There were stalls for country produce (with regional country conveners), wool, cretonne, white work, ladies accessories, babies wear, MLC badge stall and surprisingly, a fortune teller! The

stall holders wore a special badge and a muslin apron that was especially printed and embroidered for helpers (old scholars) to wear. We have two aprons are in our archive collection.

The above newspaper cutting shows old scholars wearing their aprons whilst helping on the stalls. This is our only snapshot of the occasion.

THE MOVE OF OUR HISTORICAL CENTRE.

As you are probably aware the Patchell building is going to be extensively renovated, for this reason we have had to move our office and archive collection to the first floor of the Harris Wing (previously the boarding house). While not an ideal working area we are pleased to have several rooms (previously bedrooms) and we have carefully stored our collection in two of the rooms. The special shelving bought to house the acid free boxes in Patchell were adapted (at a cost) to fit the new space. The cost of moving all office items, furniture and boxed items was covered by the Association and some help from old scholar donations in 2022.
