Avis Miller OAM - Principal of Annesley College 1983—1996

Prior to this appointment she and her husband and family lived in Fiji for eight years, Whyalla and Victor Harbor where she was Deputy Principal for two years.

At Avis's farewell, Sue Johnson, Chairman of Council, said: Mrs Miller's contribution to the school has been outstanding. Re-establishing the kindergarten, making Annesley College one of the front runners with Information Technology, encouraging our entries in the World Solar Challenge, the Rock & Roll Eisteddfod, Community courses and to the completion of the Senior College.

From Sue's Council Report 1996: "During those years we have faced changes in society and education of a magnitude and at a rate not seen before. Mrs Miller has ensured that Annesley College has kept pace with all that is good in these changes, yet still maintained the intrinsic spirit of our school. A great achievement indeed!"

In her retirement, Avis helped found the Pt Elliot Information Technology Access Centre.

In 1996 Mary was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia and in 1997 she was the inaugural winner of the Paul Harris Award, created by Rotary International, in recognition of outstanding service to the development and progress of women in the community.

Ruth Nellie Rogers ('43) - attended MLC 1940–43. When Ruth was awarded the Australian College of Education's prestigious College Medal in 1995, the citation read that it was for her untiring work as a teacher, administrator, program and conference organiser and Deputy Director of Education. In 1999 she became the President of the Australian Council of the World Education Fellowship.

Dianne Winifred Fuller (Pointon '52) - Head Prefect of the Boarding house, Staff Member 1968-78, 80 and past parent.
